CV003 Child-Centered Curriculum

This video follows infant and toddler caregivers and teachers as they plan curriculum in a center-based care environment. Teachers observe each child; then work as a team to develop curriculum for that child.

CV004 Infancy: Emotional & Social World

This latest perspective portrays the remarkable early development of emotions and suitable adult responses to the strong emotions of crying and anger, the learning of self-regulation, significant interchange in queing and guiding early behavior. The video marks four stages of emotional milestones in infancy and

how emotional closeness is experienced through synchrony, social referencing, and finally, separation-individuation.

CV005 Investing In Caring Relationships

This video shows infants/ toddlers in childcare away from parents. Each child needs a caregiver who provides time, focus, and consistency, shows responsiveness, and communicates with the child in many ways. The child thrives with this impact of emotional investment by the caregiver.

Learning for the very young child is centered on the moment-to-moment experiences. In this video infants, toddlers, and two's explore problem solving. Cognitive curriculum is revealed through the interactions of children and caregivers involved with materials and the environment.

All of the child's developing senses are used in understanding his surroundings. Teachers and caregivers will show us how they plan materials specifically for involving and providing a sense of safety and security so the very young child can use the "messy" and enjoy freedom. In this video language meaning is made through the important relationships the young child has with caregivers. Parents and caregivers share information concerning the child's language and ways to enhance the communication both at home and in childcare. CV009 Emotional Beginnings—A Staff Development Program for Infant and Toddler Caregivers.

This includes Site Coordinators Guide, Presentation Posters, Video, and Caregiver Handbooks. The materials in this curriculum package use an on-going staff development model as a way to increase the emotional availability and relationship-building skills of child-care providers. The curriculum presents ten

topics, each covering a key concept of the kind of emotionally responsive care giving that is especially critical to infants and toddlers.

This includes Educators guide, parent handouts and activity cards. The materials in this curriculum series were developed specifically for adolescent parents and for parents who have had less than optimal parenting examples themselves. The curriculum teaches emotional communication, parent/infant interaction, and skills for emotional regulation, and it addresses the emotional development of the dyad. The educators guide includes topics which contain lesson plans, conceptual material, strategies for teaching concepts, overheads, posters, games, questionnaires and activity cards that support parent-infant interaction.

CV011 Exploring First Feelings

Using actual footage of parents and caregivers interacting with their young children, this tape illustrates milestones in the emotional development of infants and toddlers. The tape's emphasis is preventative and aims to promote the mental health of infants and young children. It displays six overlapping stages of healthy emotional development showing a parent or caregiver providing a supportive environment for each stage. This tape is based on the work of Stanley Greenspan, M.D. and his colleagues at the National Institute of Mental Health.

Watching this video of infants who have been allowed to move freely since their earliest months will help you to see the grace, agility, and coping skills that infants can acquire on their own if not impeded by restrictive devices such as walkers, swings or bouncers. The video also shows how babies learn to roll over, sit, stand and walk naturally if they have not been propped or “helped” before they have matured enough to move in the way they are ready.

THE INFANT-PARENT INSTITUTE

CV025 The Entire (6) Training Tape Series in Infant Mental Health by Michael Trout

The six training tapes include: 1. The Nature of Human Attachments in Infancy (56min). This is a historical overview of infant mental health, with current thoughts on the process by which human infants and their primary caretakers develop a bond; what difference it makes to the infant's mental, motor, physical and emotional development, and how we may notice when such a bond is absent or conflicted. 2. The Psychological Dimensions of Pregnancy and Delivery (56min). A description of the intense but quite normal psychological work engaged in by a pregnant woman, how it changes her relationship with her mate, what difference this work makes for her future relationship with the baby. 3. Conducting an Infant Mental Health Family Assessment (58min). Discusses methods used to elicit material from families regarding the nature of their relationship with the baby and etiology of the breakdown in their bond with the baby. Vignettes of interviews with families are used to demonstrate how information is sometimes offered by way of parent-infant interaction, or by way of stories or behaviors. 4. The Newborn, the Family and the Dance (58min). A discussion, with tape clips from both normal and troubled families, of the ways in which real or imagined characteristics of the newborn affect the way in which he is integrated into the family, and the nature of his relationships with primary caretakers. 5. The Birth of a Sick or Handicapped Baby: Impact on the Family (57min). Examines the struggles engaged in by parents and siblings to integrate a newborn with a disability or chronic illness into the family. 6. Infant Mental Health: A Psychotherapeutic Model of Intervention (95min). An extremely practical video dealing with actual looks at infant-parent psychotherapy.
