

## The New Jersey Infant/Toddler Credential

New Jersey has a deep commitment to providing quality child care for the state's infants and toddlers by providing programs that support strong nurturing relationships, cultural competencies and diverse learning styles and needs. The key to quality is the teachers who care for

## The New Jersey Infant/Toddler Credential can be earned by submitting:

- NJ Infant/Toddler Credential Enrollment Application (found at www.njcite.org) and the Administration fee of \$350.
- Transcripts and/or documentation of clock hours of training:
  - 120 approved non-credit training hours related to the Key Indicators of Quality found in The Learning Guide for the New Jersey Infant/Toddler Credential OR
  - Infant/Toddler CDA (other CDA which includes 30 hours of infant/toddler specific training) <u>OR</u>
  - 9 College credits related to Key Indicators of Quality OR
  - AA or BA in early childhood education, child development, human development or related field.
- 2. Transcripts of the completion of 2 college courses (3 credits each): Social & Emotional Development: Infant Mental Health for Practitioners and Supervised Field Work in Infant and Toddler Settings.
- 3. Portfolio demonstrating how knowledge is applied to program implementation.
- 4. Documentation of appropriate work experience.

  (Minimum of 6 months with children under three years of age)
- 5. Written feedback on observation and field experience completed by Supervised Field Work course instructor.
- Two letters of recommendation: One from a parent in program and one from a supervisor. Family child care providers submit two letters from parents.
- 7. Reflective personal essay and statement of commitment.
- 8. A copy of the completed *Learning Guide for the New Jersey Infant/Toddler Credential.* (Can be purchased for \$20 at www.njcite.org)
